

FY 2024 Anti-Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

1. ABOUT THIS STATEMENT

Nippon LP Resources UK Limited (“NLPR UK”) is managing investment in a copper mine in Chile. NLPR UK is incorporated in England and Wales (Company number 11135506).

The Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the “Act”) requires certain businesses to provide disclosure concerning their efforts to address the issues of Slavery and Human Trafficking in their supply chain.

As a company doing business in the UK, NLPR UK has produced FY2024 Anti-Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement (the “Statement”) in response to requirements of Section 54 of the Act.

The statement is intended to communicate the steps that NLPR UK has taken during the previous fiscal year of 1 January 2024 to 31 December 2024 to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not occurring in any part of its supply chains.

TRAINING


