MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT

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INTRODUCTION

Sopex London Ltd (“Sopex London”) reaffirms its commitment to preventing modern slavery, forced labour, child labour and human trafficking in all aspects of its operations and supply chains.

Since our first Modern Slavery Statement in 2020, we have implemented meaningful steps towards improving transparency, identifying risks, and taking concrete actions to mitigate them.

In 2025, we continue to uphold our zero-tolerance approach, aligned with the Group Sopex ESG Strategy.

This Statement, covering the financial year ending 31 December 2024, has been reviewed and approved by the Board of Directors of Sopex London and is signed by its Chairman.

STRUCTURE & SUPPLY CHAIN

Sopex London, established in 1988, is a sugar commodity trading company and one of the leading actors for organic and specialty sugar in the European market.

We employ 10 people and are currently located in New London House, 6 London Street, London EC3R 7LP.

We source organic and conventional sugar from all around the globe.

These suppliers are local and international sugar processors and exporters with whom we have developed long term partnerships.

Our suppliers are carefully selected to guarantee a robust and sustainable sugar supply chain.

Sopex London belongs to the family owned N.V Group Sopex S.A (Group Sopex), based in Antwerp and specialized in agricultural commodity trading.

POLICIES ON MODERN SLAVERY

In line with our ESG framework, the following internal policies have been formally adopted and are applicable to Sopex London:

- Code of Ethics
- Supplier Code of Conduct
- Business Code of Conduct
- Antibribery & corruption policy
- Whistleblowing Policy

Each policy explicitly includes a prohibition of all forms of modern slavery and reaffirms our responsibility to respect human rights.

These documents will be publicly available on the Group Sopex website and accessible to all stakeholders.

DUE DILIGENCE & RISK ASSESSMENT

We have strengthened our due diligence procedures with the verification of Bonsucro, Fairtrade, and Organic certifications, where applicable.

In 2025, we started working on a supplier ESG performance dashboard by sending out questionnaires to our suppliers through our operations division.

Once the results will be consolidated we'll set specific indicators & review them annually.

MEASURES & TRAINING

To ensure that our policies are understood and embedded:

- All staff member based in London will receive annual training on human rights and modern slavery.
- Our procurement and trading teams are trained to apply the Supplier Code of Conduct when engaging partners.

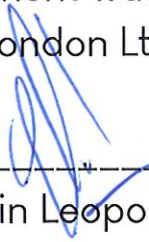

We will continue to raise awareness through targeted training sessions.
