

MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT

**For Harrison SD Holdings Limited
(Financial Year ending March 2026)**

1. Introduction

We are committed to providing a high standard of ethical conduct within our business. We take our responsibility under the Modern Slavery Act 2010 ("the Act") very seriously. This statement outlines the steps we have taken and plan to take to ensure that slavery and human trafficking have no home within any part of our business or supply chain.

2. Organisation structure, and supply chains

Organisation Structure

We are the holding company for Harrison Catering Services Limited ("our Subsidiary"). We supply management services to our Subsidiary.

Supply Chain

Our supply chain is very limited. The only suppliers we have used during this period are professional service providers.

3. Policies in relation to slavery and human trafficking

4. Due diligence processes

Within our business

Harrison SD Holdings Limited does not have any employees, other than the directors.

Supply Chain

Our supply chain is very limited and the suppliers are also used by our Subsidiary which carries out due diligence.

5. Risk Assessment and Management

We have carried out the risk assessment of the professional service organisations we have engaged and are comfortable that they have processes and systems in place to ensure the prevention of unethical business practices and to adhere to the Act.

6. Training on modern slavery and trafficking

Harrison Learning Hub is an interactive e-learning platform, run by our Subsidiary which ensures relevant staff receive training on modern slavery and trafficking. It provides a personalised written record of completed training.

7. Approval by the Board

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Act and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31st March 2026. This statement was unanimously approved by our Board of Directors on 30th July 2026.

8. Review

This statement shall be reviewed by our Board of Directors on a regular basis (at least annually) and may be amended from time to time.
