Compliance

We follow all UK employment laws and regulations including health and safety. We make sure all staff have the right to work in the UK. We ensure that wages are paid on time. We ensure no one is forced to work against their will or treated badly.

Staff awareness and Training

Training will be provided to all staff to raise awareness about modern slavery, its indicators, and the actions they can take to report concerns. We aim to ensure that all staff are equipped to identify and address instances of modern slavery by promoting a culture of vigilance and responsibility.

Employee Rights and Wellbeing

We maintain a safe and inclusive working environment that respects the rights and dignity of our staff.

Our Suppliers

Our suppliers includes the companies we buy things from. We buy food, toys, cleaning items, and office supplies. We expect the companies we buy from to treat their workers fairly. We look for partners who do not use child labor or forced labor.

What We Do to Stop Slavery

- We train our staff to spot signs of slavery or harm.
- We do background checks on our staff to keep children safe.
- We only buy from companies that share our values.
