
Afton Chemical UK Holdings Limited and its subsidiaries, Afton Chemical Limited and Afton Cooper Limited (together “Afton”), as part of the NewMarket corporate group, are firmly opposed to any form of forced labour, child labour, human trafficking and slavery. Afton does not condone any such unlawful conduct by its employees, suppliers, service providers and other business partners. Afton has adopted a Policy against Slavery and Human Trafficking.

Afton requires that all suppliers and service providers comply with all applicable laws, including those local laws relating to labour practices, forced labour and child labour. In the event that a credible report is received, Afton will conduct an investigation and take appropriate action to ensure compliance with local law.

Afton conducts compliance training, including on the prevention of human trafficking, for its employees who have responsibility for supply chain management.
