Modern Slavery Statement

Introduction

This statement applies to The Barcode Warehouse Group Limited (referred to in this statement as 'The Barcode Warehouse', 'we', 'us', 'our'), which includes The Barcode Warehouse Limited and TBW No.1 Limited.

It is a priority for The Barcode Warehouse to ensure that we trade ethically, source responsibly and work to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking throughout our organisation and in our supply chain. We take seriously any allegation of human rights abuse in all its forms and will not tolerate human rights' abuse against individuals within our own organisation or our supply chain.

We have taken steps to identify areas where there are risks of modern slavery occurring within our business and supply chain and we are working to eliminate that possibility.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for 1st May 2025 to 30th April 2026.

Our Commitment

This statement sets out our current risk analysis and the steps that we have taken and those we plan to take to deliver on this commitment.

We acknowledge our responsibilities in relation to tackling modern slavery and we commit to complying with the provisions in the Modern Slavery Act 2015. We understand that this requires an ongoing review of internal practices in relation to our labour force and additionally, our supply chains.

We do not enter into business with any other organisation, in the United Kingdom or internationally, which knowingly supports or is found to involve itself in slavery, servitude and forced or compulsory labour.

Throughout the provision of our services no labour is obtained by means of slavery or human trafficking. We strictly adhere to the standards required in relation to our responsibilities under relevant employment legislation in the United Kingdom and in many cases exceed those minimums in relation to our own employees.

Our Supply Chain

We use a wide range of suppliers both for sourcing products and materials and providing our services. These include third-party suppliers, distributors and agents with which we maintain relationships either directly or through our long-standing supply chain partners. Our suppliers are based in the United Kingdom and internationally and we work with some of the world's leading barcoding technology brands.

We understand that some of our suppliers are intermediary traders and therefore have further contractual relationships with lower-tier suppliers.

We have a zero tolerance approach to any form of slavery or human trafficking, whether within our business or in our supply chain. We are committed to making sure that, as far as we are able, there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business.

Our Governance and Due Diligence Approach

We carry out due diligence processes to ensure slavery and/or human trafficking does not take place in our business, including ensuring our key suppliers are also compliant with the Modern Slavery Act.

Having undertaken due diligence to identify and mitigate modern slavery risks within our business, we consider our main exposure to the risk of slavery and human trafficking is in the manufacturing of the equipment and label and paper products we procure and distribute because it may involve the provision of labour in a country where protection against breaches of human rights may be limited. Whilst we have no direct access to our supplier's supply chain, we have undertaken proportionate steps to ensure compliance with Modern Slavery legislation, including positive obligations within our contracts with our suppliers to ensure that there is no form of modern slavery within their supply chain and that they and their supplier chain complies with relevant modern slavery legislation, including a Supplier Code of Conduct which outlines such responsibilities and requirements and as such, are confident that our suppliers have undertaken the appropriate due diligence to satisfy any concerns that they may have within their supply chain.

We undertake audits of our supply chain where we feel it is necessary to ensure compliance with any such terms and conditions and supplier code of conduct accordingly.

On the basis of our current knowledge, we therefore consider the risk of slavery and human trafficking taking place within our business and our supply chains to be low.

We have appropriate policies in place that underpin our commitment to ensure that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains or in any part of our business, including:

- Ethics Policy
- Corporate Social Responsibility Policy
- Supplier Code of Conduct
- Purchase Terms & Conditions
- Whistleblowing Policy

We continuously review and update all our policies.

Training

We continue to ensure that there is a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and provide regular training to all our employees, which includes anti-bribery and corruption and modern slavery and human trafficking. Training is provided to all employees at onboarding and then every two years thereafter, or upon any legislative or guidance changes which necessitate additional training.

We shall continue to develop our training and awareness programme. Training includes Slavery & Servitude, Forced and Compulsory Labour, Human Trafficking & Modern Slavery in the supply chain.

Further Steps

During the financial year 2025/2026, we have continued to develop:

- our governance policies;
- our risk profile and assessments;
- our continued assessment of our supplier's compliance with the Modern Slavery Act;
- enforcement of our process for all new suppliers which includes compliance with (amongst other matters) the Modern Slavery Act;
- ongoing review and enforcement of our Supplier Code of Conduct in all dealings with our supply chain by way of incorporation into our standard purchase and partnership terms.


