

UK Modern Slavery Act – Transparency Statement

Transparency in supply chains

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of Modern Slavery Act 2015 ('the Act') and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 March 2023. This statement will be reviewed on an annual basis, in line with our compliance monitoring programme.

Modern Slavery statement

Robey Warshaw is aware that slavery, servitude, forced labour and human trafficking (Modern Slavery) is a global and a growing issue. We have zero tolerance to Modern Slavery and are committed to putting effective systems and controls in place to safeguard against any form of Modern Slavery taking place within the business or our supply chain. This reflects our core values to act ethically and with integrity in all business dealings.

Due diligence in our supply chains

Robey Warshaw considers the risk of Modern Slavery within our supply chain to be low. In general, our supply chain consists of regulated professional advisers and service providers, all typically based in the UK. We also use a number of third-party suppliers in our supply chain in relation to ancillary functions such as cleaning and catering. We have taken a risk-based approach towards our supply chain, taking into account qualitative factors including industry or sector risk. We have also conducted research in order to determine which suppliers are directly bound by the Act and, where appropriate, requested additional evidence of compliance such as copies of relevant certifications or policies. In relation to suppliers that we consider to be higher risk, we have informed them of our commitment to complying with the requirements of the Act and our resulting responsibilities.

We will continue to monitor the effectiveness of our policies and procedures regarding Modern Slavery and take the necessary steps to ensure that they remain appropriate.
