

Modern Slavery Statement

EP UK Investments Limited (EPUKI) is a UK energy company which, together with its subsidiaries (referred to as 'we' and 'our' hereinafter), primarily focuses on power generation from conventional and renewable sources. EPUKI is jointly owned, in equal shares, by Energetický a průmyslový holding and TotalEnergies. This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes the anti-slavery and anti-human trafficking statement made by EPUKI on behalf of itself and its relevant UK registered affiliates for the financial year ending 31st December 2025.

EPUKI is committed to protecting and respecting human rights and we have a zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery and human trafficking whether within our own business or within our supply chain.

This statement highlights the key risk areas and activities we have undertaken during the financial year ending 31st December 2025 to combat modern slavery in our organisation and supply chain.

Supplier adherence to our values

We ensure all those in our supply chain comply with our values and we have in place a supply chain compliance programme.

We continue to monitor and ensure that our supply chain contracts include extensive anti-slavery protections, prohibiting suppliers and their employees and subcontractors, from engaging in any form of modern slavery.

We take a risk-based approach and monitor activity to identify any risk which may arise in our supply chain.

Recruitment

Our HR department has stringent policies in place governing the recruitment process and utilises only reputable recruitment agencies after EPUKI has undertaken pre-contract evaluation.

In terms of general recruitment, we comply with all relevant laws and regulations including without limitation ensuring that all employees are legally permitted to work in the UK, have a written contract of employment and are informed about holiday and sickness entitlements and benefits.

Policies

We have appropriate policies in place that underpin our commitment to ensure that no form of modern slavery exists in our supply chains or any part of our business. We review our Modern Slavery Policy as required and at least once during a three-year period.

Our modern slavery policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains. In addition to our modern slavery policy, we maintain a range of policies across the business relevant to modern slavery, such as an anti-corruption and bribery policy, corporate social responsibility for suppliers' policy and grievance procedure.

Reporting Issues

We have clear lines of reporting across our business in addition to a dedicated contact for reporting any concerns or risks around modern slavery.

Awareness

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery in our supply chains and our business, we continue to monitor legislation and update our policies and training as required.

Next Steps

Following a review of the effectiveness of the steps we have taken in 2025 to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our supply chains, we will continue with the steps set out above, monitoring our business and supply chain and encouraging any concerns to be raised through the reporting channels. Policies and procedures will be regularly reviewed, and any necessary updates reflected in them.
