

## Modern Slavery Act Statement

### **Background**

This statement, made pursuant to section 54 of the The United Kingdom Modern Slavery Act 2015, constitutes Indometal (London) Limited's modern slavery and human trafficking statement; and sets out the approach taken by the Company to understand all potential modern slavery risks related to its business, and the action undertaken to mitigate any such risk as required by the Act, for our financial year ended 31 December 2024.

### **Scope**

Indometal (London) Limited ("Indometal") is a subsidiary of PT. TIMAH Tbk, an Indonesian based tin metal producer, smelter and a world class exporter with global market share up to 15%. Indometal is a physical trading team incorporated in England and Wales (Company number: 02224189) taking its main supply from its parent company and therefore it may be within the scope of the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015 (the "Act").

Other subsidiaries do not carry on business, or part of a business, in the UK. Accordingly, are not subject to the Act and are therefore excluded from the ambit of this statement.

### **Statement**

Indometal is committed in delivering high standard of corporate governance and one of the key elements is by underpinning social responsibility in managing the company. The Company aims to operate in the highest ethical and professional standards; and to always comply with local law and regulation applicable to its business. It includes outright commitment in preventing slavery and human trafficking in its corporate activities and supply chains.

Indometal equally expect the same or higher standards from those parties with whom the Company engage, such as its suppliers and customers.

The services Indometal provides to its clients are office-based with majority or all of work undertaken is by Indometal's own staff. As a result of this assessment and due to the nature of our business, there is a low risk of slavery and human trafficking in our business hence Indometal has not identified a need to take any additional action with regard to such service.

On the occasions where Indometal contracts others to assist in the provision of services we take steps to ensure they have any relevant accreditations and are appropriately qualified. Given the nature of these relationships Indometal also considers them very low risk and, as such, will take no additional steps beyond our existing supplier review and approval process.

In conclusion, given the low risk profile of anyone supplying us with services being involved in slavery and/or human trafficking, we believe our current procedures and reliance on regulatory oversight in relation to the provision of services is sufficient.

This statement however, which will be reviewed annually as well as the effectiveness of relevant policies and procedures; and updated as required, has been reviewed by the Board, senior management and has been approved by the Director of Indometal (London) Limited.
