Voluntary Modern Slavery Statement

This statement has been published in accordance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015. It sets out the steps taken by AVENT Global Limited and Brunswick Medical Limited during the 2023/4 financial year to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking in its business and supply chains. Both companies fully support the UK Government's objectives to eradicate modern slavery and human trafficking.

Organisational Structure

AVENT Global Limited and Brunswick Medical Limited are both private limited companies limited by shares. The company operates in the UK. Our services include logistics management and commercialisation support.

Supply Chain, Due Diligence, Risk Assessment, Training

We know that whilst we are not a 'relevant' organisation (revenue <£36M p.a.) our Supply Chain presents the greatest risk of Slavery and Human Trafficking so our relationship with our suppliers is an essential part of our commitment to preventing modern slavery.

Our Modern Slavery strategy and processes include, but are not limited to, the following:


- All suppliers that are in scope of the Modern Slavery Act must provide their statement.
- An assessment for all new suppliers to comply with and procedural or legislative code.

Where the company, its suppliers or customers develop any concerns relating to modern slavery, they are raised with the Board of Directors. Appropriate action will then ensue.

Further, both companies have ensured the following:

- Training for all employees via our HR portal on the Modern Slavery Act and associated risks.
- Monthly meetings to proactively assess whether our activities or partners present a risk. Due diligence and risk assessments are undertaken and documented where required.
- We will publish our annual statements on our website.
