About Thought Machine

Thought Machine builds a next generation cloud native core banking platform and works with a wide range of banks and new digital banking propositions.

As a UK-headquartered financial technology company, with regional offices in the US, Singapore and Australia, Thought Machine operates in a sector and within regions that are at a relatively low risk of slavery, unlawful child labour or human trafficking.

to: ensure that all employees are legally entitled to work in relevant jurisdictions; and safeguard employees from any abuse or coercion. In addition, where possible, we perform thorough criminal and employment background checks on employees.

To ensure Thought Machine identifies wrongdoing, we have policies in place to ensure staff feel confident that they can expose misconduct without any risk to themselves and we have procedures for confidential whistleblowing.

Our supply chain

Due to the nature of our business, we mainly contract with suppliers where the chances of modern slavery are low (e.g. technology providers). Therefore, we assess ourselves to have a low risk of modern slavery in our business and supply chains. Regardless, Thought Machine has supply chain management procedures to mitigate the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking. In addition, we do not enter into business with any organisation, in the UK or abroad, which knowingly supports or is found to be involved in slavery, servitude and forced or compulsory labour.
